

## **LABS Transparency Policy**



#### 1.0 Objective

The LABS Transparency Policy will define what information will be published in the public domain and what information will be kept internal to LABS.

#### 2.0 Scope

This policy applies to all LABS Participants, including brands, retailers, agents, and factories.

#### 3.0 Guiding Principles

- 3.1 Transparency is vital for the safety of the workers making products for LABS Participants. Sharing factory safety information will show what issues were identified during the assessments, corrective actions that were implemented to help remediate the identified issues, status of each of the Corrective Action Plans (CAPs), factories that have successfully completed the remediation steps, and factories that have been suspended due to lack of progress on remediation or due to a life-threatening situation identified during on-site assessments.
- 3.2 Some information deemed sensitive for the participating brands ("Brand Sensitive Information") will not be shared with the public. Brand sourcing strategies, sourcing countries, production volumes, and sourcing factories could be considered as Brand Sensitive Information and should not be shared with other brands or the public. Each brand's legal, compliance, and supply chain teams will develop and maintain their own transparency policies. A private section in LABS Fair Factories Clearinghouse Platform\* ("LABS FFC Platform") will be established for Brand Sensitive Information. Each brand will determine what information will be uploaded to this private section.
- 3.3 LABS Foundation and all participants to LABS' Program activities are committed to full and fair competition. LABS Foundation and LABS Participants shall act in accordance with applicable competition laws at all times and the Program's activities, including the sharing of information, shall not be in any way inconsistent with relevant competition laws.

#### 4.0 Efficient Uploading of Information to LABS FFC Platform

- 4.1 To maintain the latest updates, accuracy, and integrity of the data, it will be important to utilize common reporting forms. Information should be automatically uploaded to the different sections of LABS FFC Platform.
  - 4.1.1 Forms and/or procedures will be established and the different technical partners will be trained on how to fill out forms and follow procedures correctly. Focus areas of the forms and/or procedures include:
    - 4.1.1.1 Assessments
    - 4.1.1.2 Assessment findings
    - 4.1.1.3 Corrective Action Plans
    - 4.1.1.4 Remediation progress
    - 4.1.1.5 Factory rating
    - 4.1.1.6 Follow-up visit report
