

Qualification Criteria - Safety Trainers



Safety Training Firms must ensure safety trainers qualifications are valid and current before he or she delivers an approved training program. Safety Trainers must have the following qualifications:

- a) Technical Structure, Fire and Electrical safety knowledge in a manufacturing industry, preferably in apparel and footwear industry; and at least ten years' experience in the approved training program topic(s), obtained through at least one of the followings:
 - i. Five years of recent occupational health and safety experience;
 - ii. A professional safety training and development designation;
 - iii. Certificate in Occupational Health and Safety from a recognized institute.
- b) A Combination of safety training delivery experience and knowledge of structural, fire and electrical safety principles obtained through at least one of the following:
 - i. More than 500 hours of safety training delivery experience in the last five years;
 - ii. A degree, diploma, or certificate in education principles from a recognized post-secondary institution; or
 - iii. Knowledge of the approved training program obtained through more than five years of recent experience delivering the approved training program topic(s);
- c) Knowledge about the Occupational Health and Safety Act, guidelines and regulations relating to joint health and safety committees.
