
Common assessment findings



Structural Safety

- Uneven floor-load distribution on suspended floors
- Exposed reinforcement on roof slab
- Cracks on structural and non-structural members (e.g., concrete beams, columns, and walls)
- Absence of documentation (e.g., structural diagrams, geo-technical reports, floor-load plans, and soil reports)

Fire Safety

- Rolling shutters on exit doors
- Insufficient emergency lights on escape paths
- Fire-rated doors and fire-rated enclosures lacking
- Overhead signages missing on escape paths
- Centralized fire-alarm system unavailable

Electrical Safety

- Flammable coating inside distribution panels
- Heavy lint and dust inside switchboards/distribution boards
- Earthing to distribution boards, MS roof truss, transformer fencing, and battery bank racks not provided
- Lighting protection system not supplied
- Numerous hotspots with high temperatures ranging from 73°C to 120°C

Remediations

India

Data comprises 108 factories where 424 follow-up visits were conducted.

Fire Safety:

- 99% of the factories installed emergency lights
- 96% of the factories removed temporary obstacles on evacuation pathways
- 97% of the factories installed illuminated exit signages
- 89% of the factories removed locking mechanisms from exit doors.

Electrical Safety:

- 90% of the factories removed lint and dust from electrical panels and DBs
- 98% of the factories reduced the high temperatures in electrical panels and DBs
- 96% of the factories provided earthing connections for electrical components.

Structural Safety:

- 78% of the factories mended cracks in beams and columns
- 79% of the factories removed the corrosion in nonengineered structures (such as MS Shed)
- 82% of the factories eliminated the wall dampness.

Vietnam

Data comprises 203 factories where 790 follow-up visits were conducted.

Fire Safety:

- 96% of the factories installed emergency lights
- 100% of the factories removed temporary obstacles on evacuation pathways
- 90% of the factories installed illuminated exit signages
- 95% of the factories removed locking mechanisms from exit doors

Electrical Safety:

- 100% of the factories removed lint and dust from electrical panels and DBs
- 99% of the factories reduced the high temperatures in electrical panels and DBs
- 93% of the factories provided earthing connections for electrical components

Structural Safety:

- 86% of the factories mended cracks in beams and columns
- 87% of the factories removed the corrosion in nonengineered structures (such as MS Shed)
- 82% of the factories eliminated the wall dampness

Cambodia

Data comprises 64 factories where 216 follow-up visits were conducted

Fire Safety:

- 97% of the factories installed emergency lights
- 100% of the factories removed temporary obstacles on evacuation pathways
- 92% of the factories installed illuminated exit signages
- 95% of the factories removed locking mechanisms from exit doors

Electrical Safety:

- 93% of the factories removed lint and dust from electrical panels and DBs
- 91% of the factories reduced the high temperatures in electrical panels and DBs
- 92% of the factories provided earthing connections for electrical components

Structural Safety:

- 94% of the factories mended cracks in beams and columns
- 98% of the factories removed the corrosion in nonengineered structures
- 96% of the factories eliminated the wall dampness

Indonesia

Data comprises 28 factories where 100 follow-up visits were conducted

Fire Safety:

- 66% of the factories installed emergency lights
- 88% of the factories removed temporary obstacles on evacuation pathways
- 76% of the factories installed illuminated exit signages
- 23% of the factories removed locking mechanisms from exit doors

Electrical Safety:

- 58% of the factories removed lint and dust from electrical panels and DBs
- 83% of the factories reduced the high temperatures in electrical panels and DBs
- 17% of the factories provided earthing connections for electrical components

Structural Safety:

- 45% of the factories mended cracks in beams and columns
- 47% of the factories removed the corrosion in nonengineered structures

Quality Assurance Measures & Updates

- Quality assurance visits were conducted across all countries of operations in Q3. Subsequently, quality assurance plans have been developed and discussed with the teams in each country to implement necessary corrective measures, with a focus on remediation uptake, follow-up visit process, and reporting.
- Mid-year performance review conducted for Associated Firms on criteria such as
 assessment skills, and reporting quality. Identified areas for improvement were promptly
 addressed with the firms, and strategies were implemented to refine the assessment
 process, reporting practices and overall timelines for CAP sign-off and design approvals
 process.

Reporting Platform Updates

LABS has a toll-free Helpline (in Vietnam, India, and Cambodia) and a LABS Chat platform (in Vietnam, India, Cambodia, and Indonesia) to enable workers to raise their concerns of unsafe working conditions.

LABS Reported Cases reported this quarter

Vietnam: one reported case related to a sewing-machine malfunction that remained unresolved for a month

The case was shared with the factory. The maintenance team inspected all sewing machines and repaired those with issues. The factory stated the underlying cause is the difficulty to control older sewing machines and they will be repaired or replaced with new machines. The factory plans to increase inspections to prevent similar problems in the future.

Indonesia: one reported case involved an evacuation route blocked by goods

The case was reported to the factory and a LABS team member visited the site. The factory shared their remediation action and assured LABS they would improve their monitoring process. The case was resolved.

Non-LABS Reported Cases

- **India:** one case concerned an HR manager's behavior
- Vietnam: one case referred to the use of excessive bleach, which caused workers' discomfort
- Cambodia: one case related to privacy violations and maternity-leave policies
- Indonesia: one case was the inadequate clinic facilities and unavailable medicines
- **Indonesia:** one case pertained to inadequate cooling in the OCM work area.

Since the factory joined the LABS Program, the factory has performed better in terms of occupational safety and health and fire-protection system safety. Regularly updated information improve [and] maintain the fire-protection system and the points of attention that LABS has instructed. Always train employees to improve according to LABS standards to not only avoid risks to the factory but also ensure employee safety.

Key Outreach and Events

India

Safety Management Systems awareness training

Training on effective safety management system implementation was given to Gokaldas Export Ltd factories. A total of 45 participants, including safety officers and maintenance team members from its 20 factories (LABS and Non-LABS), attended the training.



Vietnam

International Footwear Conference

July 8, 2024

The LABS team in Vietnam participated in the 41st International Footwear Conference, hosted by the Vietnam Leather, Footwear and Handbag Association (LEFASO) and the Confederation of International Footwear Associations (CIFA). The event emphasized sustainability, innovation, and collaboration for the industry's future. Participants included representatives from various government organizations, international organizations, associations, and LEFASO members.





Annual Safety Seminar hosted by the Ministry of Construction

August 23, 2024

The LABS team in Vietnam participated in the Annual Safety Seminar hosted by the Ministry of Construction. The seminar, with over 150 participants, focused on updates in the National Code for Fire Safety in buildings. During the session, the LABS team shared best practices to further promote safety in the apparel and footwear industry.

Cambodia

LABS Safey Management System training

August 1, 2024 and August 21, 2024

A training session for LABS Safety Management System was conducted in English for 71 participants with representatives from over 60 factories and brand team members. Additionally, five non-LABS factories joined the session. The second, refresher training was conducted in Khmer with over 50 participants from 40 factories.

Indonesia

Best Practice session

August 9, 2024

This session aimed to ensure that factory teams understood the graduation criteria, proper remediation practices in line with LABS standards, the significance of a Safety Management System (SMS), and the implementation of SMS within their facilities. The best practice session had participants from 20 factories in Indonesia.

Design Process workshop

September 24, 2024

The workshop was conducted for member factories to explain the requirements of the design and drawings' approval process and to share the key details expected to be incorporated in various designs pertaining to fire, electrical, and structural-safety issues (including fire-rated doors, lighting protection systems, single-line diagrams, etc.). Overall, 78 factory representatives attended this workshop.

Vietnam

August 7, 2024

A fire incident was reported at the Shingmark Vina Factory.

Cambodia

July 31, 2024:

A roof collapsed in a new building construction for the Ventura Leatherware Manufactory CO LTD factory located in Samraong Tong District, Kampong Speu Province. No injuries or deaths were reported.

August 9, 2024

A fire erupted in the early morning at Kwan Tong Factory inside the scrap-cardboard, waste-storage facility. The factory is located in Choam Chao, Por Sen Chey District, Phnom Penh.

Indonesia

July 25, 2024:

PT Avia Avian Tbk (AVIA) suffered a severe fire at one of its solvent raw-material warehouses. The blaze took place at the Avian Brands factory situated on Jalan Raya Buduran, Sidoarjo. There were neither casualties nor ongoing operations during the incident.

July 25, 2024:

A fire engulfed a plastic-pellet processing factory in Buran Village, Tasikmadu District, Karanganyar Regency. The cause of the blaze was attributed to an explosion in the electrical panel. The inferno destroyed two buildings, production equipment, and plastic raw materials estimated at IDR 10 billion. Fortunately, no casualties were reported.

August 1, 2024:

A fire broke out at a textile factory located on Jalan Raya Dayeuhkolot, Pasawahan Village, Dayeuhkolot District, Bandung Regency.

September 26, 2024:

A fire at the Fajar Paper Factory located in Kampung Gardu Sawah, Kalijaya, West Cikarang, Bekasi Regency resulted in neither fatalities nor injuries.
